

OCC Foundation Celebrates 25 Years

More Than \$63 Million Has Been Donated Since 1986

The Orange Coast College Foundation is celebrating its silver anniversary with a special edition of its 2010-2011 annual report that outlines the Foundation's legacy-more than \$63 million in donations during the past 25 years that support students and campus programs and projects.

Doug Bennett, who was hired in January of 1986, describes his role as the first full-time executive director of the Foundation as "the opportunity of a lifetime."

"The college had already started building a tradition of entrepreneurial philanthropy," Bennett said. He credits Dave Grant, former OCC president and dean of students, and Sharon Donoff, former vice president of student services, for laying the groundwork for the Foundation's success. The Foundation has also received support from volunteer board members, community volunteers, faculty, staff and more than 20,000 donors.

Among those donors are 590 current OCC employees who contributed \$968,000 to the Foundation and 545 retirees who donated another \$1.9 million.

"The OCC Foundation has helped change the lives of thousands of students," the executive director said. More than \$9.8 million in scholarships has been distributed to 6,500 students since the Foundation opened its doors.

The Foundation has led the way on major fundraising campaigns including the \$1 million Robert B. Moore Theatre renovation, \$1.5 million to build the Harry and Grace Steele Children's Center, \$900,000 for the school-age classroom building, a \$1 million endowment to support the OCC Crew, \$2 million for the Frank M. Doyle Arts Pavilion and \$1 million for the School of Sailing & Seamanship Nautical Library and offices.
